#### Chili Cookoff

Post 24 will once again be co-hosting the *South Dakota State Chili Cookoff* in 2018. This will be the second year we've been involved with the event, and we need your help.

If nothing else, please spread the word, and let others know that the cook off will be held on Saturday, August 18<sup>th</sup> (during the Brown County Fair), in the east end of Centennial Village. Public tasting of the chili, at \$1 for 4 samples, is one of the primary sources of funding for the event, and the more people who attend, the better this event will be for Your American Legion post. Tickets for the tasting go on sale at 12:30 that day, and the tasting begins at 2:00.

We are also, however, always looking for chili cooks to help make the event great. Prizes of up to \$500 (depending on category) are available, and there is a separate award handed out for first-time cooks. This is an ICS (International Chili Society) sanctioned event, and qualifier for the ICS World Chili Cookoff, so you will need an ICS number to enter, but they have come out with a special, "one event" (per year) membership option that is only \$10 annually.

Not a cook, but want to help? Judges, scorers, and people to sell sample tickets and raffle tickets are also needed for the event.
