Are you ready for Spring? Silly question but since I have your attention I will tell you Post 24 is looking for candidates to run for Post positions in April. All spots are open.




Time is here for High School Junior boys to apply for Boys State. Please encourage those young men to apply on line. The experience will last a lifetime.
