There will be a nationally organized ride of Legionnaires from border-to-border along "The American Legion Memorial Highway" (US-281). Along the route, the ride will be stopping at Centennial Posts (those constituted 100 years ago, along with The American Legion) located on/near the Highway.

The South Dakota portion of the ride will be Friday, August 2^{nd} , with the hand-off of banners at the SD/ND state line approximately 7:30am. The ride will then come south to Fredrick and then to Aberdeen, where the post is welcoming them at Stutsman Harley-Davidson (717 385th Ave, 1 mile west of the US-281 intersection on US-12) approximately 9:10am.

All post members are welcome to stop out for a short program commemorating the ride, and 100 years of the Sidney L Smith post in Aberdeen.
