Currently the American Legion is monitoring 13 bills in this years Legislative Session in Pierre. Important ones to me are SB 35 (revise appropriation for State Veterans Cemetery), HB 1069 which authorizes certain veterans to attend technical institutes with no tuition payment, and HB 1036 which concerns certain military specialty license plates. Others bill numbers are: SB77, HB's 1030, 1034, 1050, 1062, 1073, 1083, 8001, and 8008. You can visit https://mylrc.sdlegislature.gov/ to track this legislation.
